Nondas Hurst Voll retired in 2006 after over thirteen years as Executive Director of The Fund for Community Progress. In that role, she worked to increase choice in workplace giving and strengthened a collaborative of 26 grassroots nonprofit agencies devoted to social change.

Prior to coming to The Fund, Nondas worked in education and government in communications and fundraising. She received degrees from Marymount College and Fordham University.

Nondas's community pursuits are equal to her professional accomplishments. She chairs the board of the Institute for the Study and Practice of Nonviolence, also serving on the boards of ACLU-RI, RI Historical Society, Rotary Club of Providence, the steering committee of Peace Mission RI, and more.

In her numerous volunteer and leadership roles, Nondas has dedicated herself to causes of peace and social justice. She has lent her voice and expertise to many organizations: Advocacy Institute, Common Cause, Community Shares USA, and others. She has also lectured on social change and social activism.

Upon her retirement, a fund was established at the Rhode Island Foundation in her name, to provide scholarships for higher education to low-income single mothers. Nondas is extremely proud of her years of service to The Fund, her accomplishments as an advocate for justice, and the endowment named in her honor.
