As a junior, Laura was selected as the recipient of a Class of 1948 Award, which included a grant to pursue independent study. Laura used her award to travel to China, where she volunteered for two weeks at the Hope Foster Home outside Beijing, caring for orphans.

Based on her commitment to making a difference, Laura was nominated by her school for a prestigious leadership program. She was later awarded a grant through that program to support a service project of her own design, Camp Eureka.

Camp Eureka is a free, one-week summer camp for children affected by domestic violence. The camp took a year and a half to plan, as well as funding, a volunteer staff and hundreds of hours of time. It was considered a tremendous success by the thirty-seven campers and twenty staffers. And thanks to Laura's leadership, the structure is in place so that Camp Eureka can continue into the future.

Laura also serves as a member of the Moses Brown Community Service Board, where she coordinates and participates in many school-related community service projects.
